

**PART-TIME ACADEMIC POSITION IN
AIDES D'ETAT (State Aid Law)**

(CORRESPONDING TO 1/10 OF A FULLTIME POSITION - 30 H/YEAR)

Description of the position

The ULB Faculty of Law and Criminology is opening a part-time (10%) academic position to teach the course 'Aides d'Etat' (DROIO609). This course covers 24 hours of teaching and is to be taught in French. Provided that the academic coordinator of the Master agrees, the course could possibly be taught in English.

The teacher also be called to supervise or assess final-year dissertations, within the Master in Law and/or the LL.M in European Law. He/She will be affiliated with the Center of European Law of ULB (Centre de Droit européen – website available here: [lien](#)) and he/she will be invited to take part and contribute to the academic activities of the Center.

Scientific and educational objectives :

This course is part of the elective courses offered to students enrolled in the LL.M program in European Law. It is taught over the second semester. It is primarily followed by the students enrolled in the LL.M program, who already hold a master degree in law (or an equivalent degree), and who have already followed a general course of competition law during the first semester ([DROIC-687 EU Competition Law](#)). Students of the general Master program may also follow the course as an elective.

The course offers students willing to specialise in the area of state aid law the opportunity to get acquainted with the field, by delving into topical questions or emblematic cases. The teacher will freely choose the topics and issues he/she focuses on, and is free to invite external guests. The teacher is encouraged to give his/her teachings an actual dimension, and to revisit the field in the light of the challenges the Union is currently facing (green transition, strategic autonomy, technological and industrial sovereignty, ...).

Students will have the opportunity to take part to the conference cycle *Les mardis du droit européen de la concurrence* which is organized annually. The teacher should take these activities into account when designing the course, and should ensure proper coordination.

The course being taught at an advanced master level, the teaching method should be interactive, and based on the discussion of relevant decisions and cases, and may be complemented by practical cases or moot court exercises.

Qualifications required

120-credit Master's degree (or licence) in law, preferably with a doctorate in law.

Skills required

- A very good command of EU competition law and state aid law and their implementation.
- A level of French enabling you to teach and evaluate work in that language (C1).
- High-quality scientific publications in these fields.

The following elements are assets

- A specialized Master's in European law and / or competition law
- Teaching experience at university or college level.
- Experience in the practice of EU competition law and state aid law
- Skills in another relevant discipline, such as economics.

This template structures your application by including the following elements:

- An application letter
- A teaching dossier including a 7,000-character report (4 pages) on the applicant's previous teaching activities and a teaching project for the first five years in this position; these must be relevant to the faculty and to the teaching profiles for the programmes to which the applicant is to contribute
- The names and e-mail addresses of five referees (respecting the gender balance) who may be contacted by those in charge of evaluating applications. These referees should not have conflicts of interest because of family or emotional ties.

Incomplete applications or applications that do not use the template provided will not be examined by the selection committee.
