Job description

The ULB Faculty of Law and Criminology is offering a renewable 5% lectureship to teach, in English, part of the 'Law and Economics of EU Trade Policy' course (DROIO611). This course is part of an interdisciplinary approach designed to cover the legal and economic aspects of the European Union's trade policy.

The course is traditionally shared between two lecturers, one recruited by the SBS Solvay Faculty and the other by the Faculty of Law and Criminology. The open vacancy concerns the legal part of the course.

The incumbent may also be called to supervise or assess final-year dissertations, within the Master in Law and / or Advanced Masters.

Educational and scientific goals :

The course aims to offer students wishing to specialise in international trade the opportunity to study in-depth the economic aspects of trade liberalisation and regulation, the law of the World Trade Organisation, and the interactions between law and economics in this field. At the end of the course, students should be able to understand key concepts and instruments of trade law, as well as the challenges faced in the context of EU trade policy.

The course is taught in the second semester and has a total timetable of 24 hours, one-half is covered by the mandate to be filled. Class sessions are generally two hours long and they take place between February and May. Examination sessions take place in June and August. The precise arrangements and timetables will be agreed with the co-instructor.

This course is one of the optional courses offered as part of the Master of Specialisation in European Law, the Master of Specialisation in International Law and the Master of Interdisciplinary Specialisation in European Studies.

Courses covered at the time of recruitment : DROIO611 – Law and Economics of EU Trade Policy (partime Th. 12h)

Qualifications required

120-credit Master's degree (or licence) in law, preferably with a doctorate in law.

Skills required

- A very good command of international trade law, including its European dimension and practical implementation
- A level of English enabling you to teach and evaluate work in this language (C1).

The following elements are assets

- High-quality scientific publications in the fields of international trade law, EU trade policy or related areas.
- A Master's degree specialising in European law and / or international law.
- Teaching experience at university or college level.
- Experience in practising international trade law
- Skills in another relevant discipline, such as economics.

- a teaching dossier including a 7,000-character report (4 pages) on the applicant's previous teaching activities and a teaching project for the first five years in this position; these must be relevant to the faculty and to the teaching profiles for the programmes to which the applicant is to contribute
- the names and e-mail addresses of five referees (respecting the gender balance) who may be contacted by those in charge of evaluating applications. These referees should not have conflicts of interest because of family or emotional ties.

Incomplete applications or applications that do not use the template provided will not be examined by the selection committee.
