Job description

From the academic year 2025-2026, the Faculty of Law and Criminology will offer a seminar on argumentation in criminal law. This course is worth 15 ECTS. It is organised in the 2nd four-month period of the 2nd block of the Master's degree in law.

The seminar on argumentation in criminal law is included in the programme as part of the argumentation seminars, a set of courses designed to put into practice the learning acquired by students during their studies. These lessons should enable students to put their legal reasoning into practice by integrating it into a process that is close to professional life (exchanging conclusions, drafting consultations, briefs and pleadings).

Teaching and scientific objectives: This seminar has a number of specific objectives, in particular:

- revision and updating of all the knowledge acquired by the student in criminal matters (criminal law, criminal procedure) in BA (2 teaching units) and MA (+/- 5 teaching units), using an active method (mock trials);
- the acquisition by the student of the basic principles of argumentation (written and verbal) and respect for the elementary ethical rules of the (future) profession, within the framework of teamwork; - mastery of the main useful sources of information in criminal law and procedure, applied to the resolution of a concrete case.

The lecturer will be attached to the Criminal Law Research Centre.

- a teaching dossier including a 7,000-character report (4 pages) on the applicant's previous teaching activities and a teaching project for the first five years in this position; these must be relevant to the faculty and to the teaching profiles for the programmes to which the applicant is to contribute
- the names and e-mail addresses of five referees (respecting the gender balance) who may be contacted by those in charge of evaluating applications. These referees should not have conflicts of interest because of family or emotional ties.

Incomplete applications or applications that do not use the template provided will not be examined by the selection committee.
