Job description

The ULB Faculty of Law and Criminology is offering two lectureships (10% each) to teach the Seminar on Argumentation in Social Law (24 hours). This course is given in the final year of the Master's degree, to two groups of no more than 25 students, each supervised by a full lecturer. After an introduction to judicial social law, the aim is to introduce students to and develop their skills in constructing rigorous legal arguments based on real-life practical cases.

This course is designed for Master's students who choose to study social law as part of their economic and social law degree. It is one of the forms that the final dissertation may take (alongside the traditional dissertation and an internship). The elements that contribute to the final mark are the personal written work (consisting of the drafting of conclusions), the oral presentation (in the form of pleadings) and the participation during the sessions.

Pedagogical and scientific objectives: to have a participative teaching method that develops students' argumentative skills, based on social law.

Courses included in the course load at the time of recruitment:

MEMOC5018 - Seminar on argumentation in employment law (24h).

Doctorate in legal sciences or 120-credit Master's degree in law (or bachelor's degree) preferably PhD supplemented by professional experience in the field, or a list of publications demonstrating the candidate's expertise in the field.

This template structures your application by including the following elements:

- an application letter
- a teaching dossier comprising a report of approximately 7,000 characters (or 4 pages) on previous teaching activities, on the one hand, and a teaching project for the first 5 years of the mandate, which fits in coherently with the vision of the entity to which the candidate is attached and with the teaching profiles of the courses to which the candidate will be expected to contribute, on the other;
- the names and contact email addresses of five referees who may be contacted by the bodies responsible for assessing the applications, with due regard to gender balance. These people must not be in a conflict of interest due to family or emotional ties.
- three publications representative of scientific work already carried out in the field of employment law.

Incomplete applications or applications that do not use the template provided will not be examined by the selection committee.
