This course visits the various criminological theories from the birth of this discipline until our days. It tends to deliver a sociological analysis of these various theories: it places them in their social context of emergence and analyzes their contributions to the discipline. It emphasizes the fact that the coherence of criminology - a discipline built itself from scattered knowledges - needs to be questioned. Indeed, the history of criminology is crossed by conflicts between various disciplines, mutual misunderstandings, but also accumulation of knowledge on crime and crime prevention.

To deliver to the students a sociological study of the various criminological theories so that they can be situated in the (sometimes stormy) contemporary debates crossing this discipline.
