Introduction: the issue of "European nationalism".

Part 1: Theoretical problems. Europe between Democracy, Nation and Empire.

1. Democracy, sovereignty, identity: the problem of the political form of Europe.

2. Resurgence of nationalism? The paradoxical persistence of the national question.

3. The nation-state as a condition for democracy? The national-sovereignist argument.

This course aims to familiarise students with major theoretical approaches to the concept of nation. Specifically, students will be encouraged to acquire knowledge and understanding of the

basic concepts which inform theoretical discussion of nationhood and to acquire knowledge and understanding of the work of selected major thinkers who have addressed major theoretical issues concerning the nation.
