Objectifs (et/ou acquis d'apprentissages spécifiques)

This course is an advanced graduate-level introduction into modern political economics. Its main objective is to teach a future researcher how to identify and frame research questions that have a political economy dimension, and to conduct theoretical and empirical analyses of such questions. This year the course will be organised as a workshop on the political economics of inequality. It will be taught/coordinated mainly by Bruno Carvalho and Micael Castanheira, and will also feature Yasmine Bekkouche for the inequality of party finance, and Paula Gobbi

for a special lecture on structural econometrics. The course is credited with (5 ECTS).

Méthodes d'enseignement et activités d'apprentissages

Lectures by the professors, plus systematic presentations by the students, workshop-style.

Contribution au profil d'enseignement

This course is an advanced graduate-level introduction into modern political economics. Its main objective is to teach a future researcher how to identify and frame his or her research questions that have a political-economic dimension and to conduct theoretical and empirical analyses of such questions. The purpose of the course is to span through a large set of the newest research in political economics (5 ECTS). This year, the course will be taught by Micael Castanheira and Bruno Carvalho. All lectures will take place at ULB.
