



# Specialized Master in EU Interdisciplinary Studies

The program includes:

One core module (25 credits) which includes a set of mandatory courses that deal with fundamental topics in EU studies, including: EU law, decision-making at the EU level, History of European integration and European Economic governance.

**Three elective modules (20 credits each)**. These include: 'Economic Governance and Policies in the EU' (module 1), 'Migrations, Rights and Policies' (module 2), 'EU integration and Regionalism and Global Governance' (module 3).

One **compulsory module on Career development (15 credits)**, including the internship and the final dissertation (drawing on the professional experience acquired through the internship).
