Job description

The School of Engineering (EPB) of the Université Libre de Bruxelles (ULB) offers a part time academic position in **Organisation and project management of construction sites**.

Located in the heart of Europe, in a dynamic neighbourhood, the School of Engineering offers a multicultural, friendly and green working environment. In partnership with the Interfaculty School of Bioengineering, the Faculty offers no less than three bachelor's degrees, 11 master's degrees, specialised master's degrees and two doctoral degrees. Each year, it trains over 200 civil engineers and bioengineers who are capable of playing an active, responsible and critical role as citizens in a changing world. Committed at local, regional and international levels, the School actively contributes to the progress and well-being of society through applied and fundamental research of the highest standard.

This position is vacant at the BATir department (Building, Architecture and Town Planning), which is unique by its multidisciplinary approach to the art of building: from soils, rocks and materials to structures, from responsible architecture to sustainable urban planning, from engineering sciences to architectural sciences; from modelling and experimental perspectives as well as design. BATir offers or participates in numerous degrees and training programmes: the Bachelors in Civil Engineering and Architectural Engineering; the joint BRUFACE Masters (in English) in Civil Engineering and Architectural Engineering; the Specialised Master in Urban Planning for Transition (in French and English); the Master in Urban Studies (in English); the Executive Master in Large Project Management (in collaboration with ADEB/VBA and VUB); and PhD degrees in Engineering Sciences & Technology and in Architecture and Urbanism.

BATir is composed of five research units: the Civil Engineering Laboratory (LGC), the Geomechanics Laboratory (LGM), the Structural and Materials Modelling Unit (SMC), the Architecture and Architectural Engineering Unit (AIA) and the Institute of Urban Planning and Regional Development (IUAT). BATir is very active in research and regularly involved in projects funded by the H2020 (Marie Curie, COST), Erasmus+ (Erasmus Mundus), FNRS (including 2 EOS, 2 MIS and numerous PDR), Innoviris, the Walloon Region and others. BATir also holds the chairs in 'Innoviris Circular Economy' and 'Great Entrepreneurs' at ADEB-VBA, which offers exploratory research grants. The BATir team is consists of more than 100 people, including 11 full-time professors, 14 lecturers, 6-5 post-doctoral researchers, 40 doctoral students, 13 teaching assistants, 5 technicians, 3 administrative assistants and numerous industrial and scientific collaborators.

The department's Curriculum Council Construction & Architecture of the School of Engineering is in charge of the training programmes in Architectural Engineering and Civil Engineering (BA+MA). The Council seeks to strengthen its teaching team with a specialist in the Organisation and project management of construction sites. This initiative is in line with the active policy in sustainability issues as forwarded by the Ecole Polytechnique.

This part time chair 'Organisation and project management of construction sites' will support the teaching at master level in the Bruface platform, a joint ULB and VUB initiative. The chair will be responsible for the course in construction project management, dealing with the full cycle of projects from design up to re-use, including the phase of construction. The chair is responsible to organise the entire course, including both theory classes and exercises.

Educational and scientific goals :

The course aims to make MA students in civil engineering and in architectural engineering aware of, and train them in, the manifold responsibilities engineers face in a construction site, ranging from the actors in the construction process; the different project stages; construction site planning and coordination (including modelling information through BIM and other tools); risk management (technical and financial), health and security on the construction site; partnerships and contracts; norms, codes and certification; over legal aspects; building specifications and cost evaluation; to ethics.

Courses covered at the time of recruitment :

CNST-H-423 "Architecture, engineering and construction project management" (5 ECTS)

Qualifications required

PhD degree in Architecture & Urbanism, Engineering Sciences & Technology, or similar (it is possible to request an exemption in case the candidate does not hold such title).

MA degree in Civil Engineering, Architectural Engineering, Architecture or Industrial Construction Engineering, or similar.

Skills required

- Fluent in English (C1 level)
- Professional experience in construction project management (practice/ academic/ administration), to be demonstrated through in a portfolio.
- Experience in teaching at university level (academic course/ workshops/ etc.)
- Good knowledge of French (B2 level), the administrative language of ULB, is recommended.

- the names and e-mail addresses of five referees (respecting the gender balance) who may be contacted by those in charge of evaluating applications. These referees should not have conflicts of interest because of family or emotional ties.

Incomplete applications or applications that do not use the template provided will not be examined by the selection committee.
